Cheshire Varieties

Arthur W Barnes (Chester 1902) Cooker, pick mid Sept., store until Sept/Oct. Particularly attractive blossom. Pollination Group 2/3

Bee Bench (Exhibited 1934) Dual purpose.

Burr Knot (1818) Cooker, pick mid-Sept., store until Oct/Nov. Can propagate from cuttings. Pollination Group 2

Eccleston Pippin (Eccleston 1883) Dual purpose, keeps shape cooked, pick mid- Sept., store until Sept/Oct. Pollination Group 2/3 SOLD OUT

Lord Clyde (Stockport 1866) Cooker, pick early Oct., store Nov-Jan. Pollination Group 2

Lord Derby (1862) Cooker, pick Oct., store until Dec. Pollination Group 4.

Millicent Barnes (Chester1903) Dual purpose, pick late Sept., store until Oct/Nov. Pollination Group 2/3

Minshull Crab (Minshull 1777) Cooker, keeps shape, very sharp, pick mid Oct., store Nov-March. Pollination Group 2

Sure Crop (Altrincham 1905) Cooker, keeps shape and makes a stiff purée, sweet, rich flavour, pick mid Oct., stores until Feb/Mar.

Withington Welter (1883) Dual purpose. Tasty and cooks to a fluff.

Other Varieties

Bardsey (unknown but probably after 1870) Dual purpose, scented of lemon, cooks to a light golden fluff, makes an excellent juice, pick late Sept., stores until mid Nov. Pollination Group 2

Hector MacDonald (Berkshire 1904) Named after 'Fighting Mac' a popular soldier figure of the late Victorian era. Cooker, cooks to pale cream puree, low acidity and mildly flavoured, pick mid to late Sept, stores until Dec.

McIntosh (Canada 1796) AKA McIntosh Red. Eating apple, very juicy, strong and sweetly perfumed, pickmid Sept., stores until December. Pollination Group 2-. SOLD OUT

Maidens on M27 rootstock (suitable for bushes, cordons, keeping in a large pot)

Cheshire Varieties

Bee Bench (Exhibited 1934) Dual purpose.

Lord Derby (1862) Cooker, pick Oct., store until Dec. Pollination Group 4

Millicent Barnes (Chester1903) Dual purpose, pick late Sept., store until Oct/Nov. Pollination Group 2/3

Minshull Crab (Minshull 1777) Cooker, keeps shape, very sharp, pick mid Oct., store Nov-March. Pollination Group 2

Withington Welter (1883) Dual purpose. Tasty and cooks to a fluff.

Other Varieties

Allington Pippin (Lincolnshire 1884) Dessert apple, heavy cropper, crunchy fruit, creamy-white juicy flesh, pick late Sept., stores until Dec. Pollination Group 3.

Bountiful (Kent, 1964) Cooker, heavy cropper, good flavoured fruit, cook to a yellow fluff, pick late Sept., stores until January. Pollination Group 3.

D'Arcy Spice (found c1785) Dessert, pick late Oct., store Jan., may crop erratically. Pollination Group 4

Lemon Pippin (English but possibly intro from Normandy, 1744) Dual purpose, lemon coloured and shaped, can smell strongly of lemon, sweet flesh, pick early Oct., stores from Dec to Mar.

Ribston Pippin (Knaresborough 1688) Triploid (vigorous variety), pick Oct., store until Jan. Pollination Group 2

M25 rootstock (suitable for full standards)

Arthur W Barnes (Chester 1902) Cooker, pick mid Sept., store until Sept/Oct. Particularly attractive blossom. Pollination Group 2/3 SOLD OUT

Bee Bench (Exhibited 1934) Dual purpose. SOLD OUT

Burr Knot (1818) Cooker, pick mid-Sept., store until Oct/Nov. Can propagate from cuttings. Pollination-Group 2 SOLD OUT

Lord Clyde (Stockport 1866) Cooker, pick early Oct., store Nov-Jan. Pollination Group 2 SOLD OUT

Lord Derby (1862) Cooker, pick Oct., store until Dec. Pollination Group 4 SOLD OUT

Millicent Barnes (Chester1903) Dual purpose, pick late Sept., store until Oct/Nov. Pollination Group 2/3 SOLD OUT

Minshull Crab (Minshull 1777) Cooker, keeps shape, very sharp, pick mid Oct., store Nov-March. Pollination-Group 2 SOLD OUT **Rival** (Introduced in Altrincham in 1900) Dual purpose, crisp, firm and juicy, lightly flavoured, pick late Sept., store until Dec. Pollination Group 3 SOLD OUT

Sure Crop (Altrincham 1905) Cooker, keeps shape and makes a stiff purée, sweet, rich flavour, pick mid Oct., stores until Feb/Mar. SOLD OUT
